Example: <u>he ran fast like a cheetah (</u>simile)

What do you like about the poem?

What made you choose this poem?

Which line or word made you stop, think, and or wonder? What did you find interesting about the line or word?

What emotions do you associate with the poem and do you think the poet was able to effectively convey these feelings?
